On My Needles

I saw a wrap pattern from Cecelia Campochiarro and knew that I had to knit it. It uses the soft silk called Kinu held together with a silk mohair. While it looks very complex it is rather a relaxing pattern. Cecelia has also given a checkoff sheet that keeps you on track. If you look at the bottom of this sheet it also tells you what percentage complete you are. I haven't decided if that is good information or not. I think it will be good when I get a little further.

I just completed writing my notes on the Gothic Wristers. Now I just have to type it up and it will be ready to go. These little wristers use 1 skein of June Cashmere DK and are deliciously soft.

Check Out Ravelry
